Hanging The Brick

The Regiment was formed in July and August 1650, and it was officially approved by Parliament on 13th August, 1650. The 'hanging of the brick' is a Sergeants' Mess tradition which dates back to Waterloo in 1815, and always takes place on a date in December prior to Christmas leave. The origins of Hanging the Brick are obscure, but it is a ceremony that has been carried out for a very long time. A large stone from Hougoumont in a special cradle and, for that day only, takes on an importance similar to that of the colours. The day before it is hung, the brick is placed in close arrest in the Guardroom and it is then 'game-on!' Tradition has it that if the Corporals and Guardsmen are able to capture the brick they can ransom it for whatever they want. Consequently it is defended by the Mess 'to the last man!'.





MISSING



In the first 4/5 years of Oxford Diecast we would regularly make samples for potential customers, but then never receive an order. Very often we wouldn't receive the sample back - so out there somewhere are quite a lot of hand made models. I presume some were just lost or thrown away whilst other could be sitting on a shelf somewhere, sometimes we gave them away as gifts to visitors or to our employees in the factory. We would take pictures of some of the samples for reference. The above is one made for Manchester City in 1998/1999. I'm hoping somebody out there knows where some of them are. Maybe some of old employees who are still members can have a look in their collections - just in case they have one hidden away!

THE HISTORY OF TAFF AND OXFORD DIECAST

2nd June 2004

I walked through the doors of the Mettoy factory in September 1977 and the first thing that hit me was the smell, a mixture of zinc, plastic and solvents from the paint - a smell that was to become so familiar over the years. It lingered throughout the factory and with practise each time you entered the factory you could detect the slight changes, sometime as a result of production problems. Week smells of solvents meant the paint machine wasn't running correctly, a strong smell of PVC usually meant that a plastic machine was being purged.

There were several factories situated on 14 acres of land, each built at different times to deal with the expansion of the company, the site was originally a railway siding. About half of the factory on the Swansea site was dedicated to the production of Corgi diecast products with the rest making a whole variety of items from record players to plastic railway sets and movie viewers. One of the factories was making Fisher Price toys under contract and ten miles down the road was a smaller unit helping in the assembly of these items. The first Mettoy factory in the UK was in Northampton and this now produced Wembley footballs, kites, plastic based items and contract diecasting for a whole range of companies. This was an engineering based company with many skilled people.

It was 7.30am in the morning and my first departmental training was in the Industrial Engineering Department with Ken (he's still with us at Oxford). I was given a clipboard and a stop watch and each day for the next two months I carried out the cycle checks in the Plastic department monitoring the efficiency of the machines. There were 50 in total and each had to be timed after which I would check the condition of the plastic components to ensure all the pieces were coming off correctly. The setting of the machine was so important and with over 10,000 moulds a very skilled job. Through these first few months I was able to build up an understanding of the workings of the machine and some of the problems involved with plastics.

On 18 October the USAAF attacked Leyte Island, followed two days later by troop landings in strength, the biggest amphibious operation in the Pacific to date. A

great battle ensued at sea and in the air, and by 25 October the Japanese Navy had been virtually destroyed in Leyte Gulf by the US 7th Fleet. The US Sixth Army fought the Japanese on the island, taking the east coast by the following day, and all organised resistance ceased by the end of the month. This is the first of the Philippine Islands to be captured, a great achievement when one considers that it is nearly 5000 miles from the nearest US Naval dockyard at Pearl Harbor. **RAF ATTACK DAMS**

The RAF has been attacking dams which supply the power for the Nazi war machine, successfully breaching the Kembs dam near Mulhouse, but on 15 October an attack by Lancasters on the Sorpe Dam in the Ruhr proved no more successful than the famous assault by the 'Dambusters' in May 1943.
