

The four-axle GE B36-7 was a high-horsepower speed racer built to be the backbone of the intermodal power fleet. There were few drag freights or slow-moving manifests for these thoroughbreds in their early years. They could usually be found in multiples at the head of the hottest of hot piggyback and autorack services and the new double-stack container trains.

By the mid-80s and early 90s, many of the original B36-7 owners began repainting or modifying their fleet. Southern Pacific removed the red emergency lights and the front and rear Gyra-lights, replacing them with a Stratolite beacon on a shop-built bracket over the headlight. Cosmetically, very little changed, except for two that received speed lettering paint in the mid 90s. Conrail began to repaint a handful of their B36-7s in the 90s with a white sill stripe and later the full 'Quality" repaint. Two of Santa Fe's B36s wore what might be the most recognizable paint scheme in railroad history: Kodachrome! This was for the failed merger between SF and SP. The unmistakable red and yellow scheme matched the colors of Kodak's "Kodacrhome" slide film boxes.





USRA BOXCAR: SINGLE-SHEATHED



During World War I the US railroads were struggling to keep up with wartime traffic, in part because of a shortage of serviceable freight cars. In an attempt to solve this problem, President Wilson nationalized the railroads under the United States Railway Administration, or USRA. One of the first tasks assigned to the USRA was to develop common designs for new freight cars. Among these was a 40' single-sheathed wood boxcar with a steel underframe.

Starting in 1918, 25,000 copies of the single-sheathed boxcar were built. Originally delivered to 22 railroads throughout the country, the cars were well received. Many cars continued in regular service in their original form well into the 1950s. Delivered with KC brake systems, many were updated to AB brake systems prior to 1953.

The USRA single-sheathed cars formed significant parts of many railroad's fleets. The New York Central System had 2,500 cars, the Milwaukee Road had 3,000 copies and the Pennsylvania had over 9,700 cars. The PRR's cars were delivered with wooden doors, but many later received either Youngstown corrugated or Creco panel doors. The Pennsy's cars were some of the longest-living with a dozen cars still listed for interchange in 1968!

Used across the SP system, these utilitarian boxcars could be seen throughout the USA and Canada. Most of the series are still in service today, many for SP successor Union Pacific and others in short line service.

Several cars from this series were purchased from the SP by Amtrak in the mid 1990's for use in express service on most trains across the system. These cars had some minor modifications including the large wheel door handle, brackets for the end of train device and struts added to the trucks for extra stability at higher speeds. BILEVEL COMMUTER CAR



Rapido Trains is proud to introduce the first of many productions of the quintessential Bilevel Commuter Car in HO Scale.

The current Bilevel design, although largely originating in Europe, found its ways to North American rails in the 1970s and has since been put to use by dozens of commuter agencies all across Canada and the United States. Originally designed by Hawker Siddeley Canada, the cars have been manufactured over the years by Hawker Siddeley, Urban Transportation Development Corporation (UTDC), SNC-Lavalin, and today, Bombardier. The cars have always been built at the original Canadian Car & Foundry (CanCar) factory in Thunder Bay, Ontario.

The Bilevel Commuter Car was originally designed in the mid-1970s at the request of the Government of Ontario (Canada) to develop a higher-capacity solution for their GO Transit commuter trains in the Greater Toronto Area. The commuter trains had grown to 10-car single-level trains during peak times and it was felt that the ideal solution was to increase the height rather than the length. Designed by Hawker Siddeley Canada and Dofasco with input from GO Transit, the first coach models entered service in 1976, while the first cab cars entered service in 1983.

In 1989, the first Bilevel cars were introduced to the United States by Tri-Rail in the Miami area. In 1992, Metrolink in the Los Angeles area introduced the design to the West Coast. This spurred further orders in California by Coaster of San Diego and Altamont Commuter Express (now Altamont Corridor Express) of San Jose. By the 2000s, more agencies across North America began using the Bilevel Commuter Cars for start-up commuter operations, such as Sound Transit (Sounder) in Seattle, FrontRunner in Salt Lake City, RailRunner in Albuquerque and West Coast Express in Vancouver, just to name a few. As of late 2020, 14 agencies across North America operate fleets totaling almost 1500 Bilevel Commuter Cars.

The Rapido model aims to finally bring museum-quality details, improved operations and prototypical accuracy to this long loved and under-appreciated mode of (commuter) transportation.







In the mid eighties, GO Transit was looking to replace its aging locomotive fleet with a specially designed locomotive that could meet the growing demands for service across the Greater Toronto Area. The locomotive needed to be able to quickly accelerate while pulling up to 10 of the new Hawker-Siddeley/UTDC BiLevel coaches, and to save on fuel, power them with a separate HEP generator.

In close consultation with GO Transit, GMD developed the F59PH. Equipped with a turbocharged 12-cylinder two-stroke diesel prime mover (12-710G3A), a full-width North American comfort cab, with HEP provided by a smaller 600hp GM 8-cylinder diesel.

In 1988, GMD delivered the first sixteen F59PH units to GO Transit. They were numbered 520 to 535 and given a class designation of GCE-430g. Over the next 6 years, GMD delivered an additional 33 units to GO Transit, with some improvements, including a larger fuel tank and different rear grille arrangement. In 1994, the final four units were delivered to GO, but were very quickly sold to Dallas' Trinity Railway Express by the cash-strapped Ontario government. Other surplus locomotives were leased to West Coast Express in British Columbia and Metrolink in California.

Due to the success of the locomotives with GO Transit, Metrolink in California placed an order for 22 F59PHs, which were delivered between 1992 and 1993. Metrolink would later lease an additional 3 units in 2018 from LTEX, to allow for PTC upgrades to be made to their own units. These are ex. GO units.

In 2007, GO Transit began retiring its fleet of F59PHs and replacing them with the MPI MP40PH-3C. Many were sold to other railroads, including AMT, Metra, NCDOT, and RB Railway Group. However, GO still has several units in service to supplement the new fleet of MP40PHs and MP54ACs.





This period was without parallel for productivity and technical innovation with many new designs and new wheel arrangements were added to the roster.

502 of these useful 4-6-0s were built by five different manufacturers in both Canada and the USA between 1905 and 1913, and many lasted until the end of CP steam service in 1961. With a top speed of 65 mph, D10s were employed

Canada & US MSRP \$599.95 DC/DCC/Sound \$499.95 DC/Silent in freight and passenger work across Canada and into the United States on CP's many branch and main lines. They were well-liked by engine crews and shop forces and the simple design was relatively easy to maintain, tough and dependable. There is truly no more useful locomotive for any steam era CPR layout than the D10.

What's better than a surprise? How about when that surprise is a run of <u>GE</u> <u>B36-7 Locomotives</u>, DCC and LokSound **ONLY**, in new, attractive paint schemes? Rapido is proud to announce five different B36-7s. Each has its own unique twist to it. Let's dig into the small details.



Of course we didn't forget the baffles! They'll be in the polybag, in the box.

When you think of SPSF, I bet "Kodachrome" is the first thing that crosses your mind. (No, not the song.) With its attractive red and yellow, it screams "80s" (and failed mergers...). With its Stratolite, unique rooftop details and the signature red number boards, the <u>SF 7497</u> surely is a sight to behold. But what about those Espee fans?

Yeah, it might be without the Gyralites, but it does have a Stratolite.

Glad you asked! For Southern Pacific, we are offering <u>TWO B36-7 Schemes</u>! First up is what we're calling the "Late" version, which is sometimes referred to as "lobotomized." What this means is the Mars light and red emergency light have been removed and a Stratolite has been added above the headlight. This bracket is an all-new piece tooled up just for this run! (We really are SPcentric...) Two road numbers are available: 7759 and 7769. For anyone thinking why I chose 7769, <u>this photo</u> of the lineup in Chicago was the inspiration.

The second SP B36-7 scheme is the famous "Speed Lettering", which was applied to two locos (7758 and 7766) in the mid 90s. Externally, these are virtually the same as the "Late" versions.



How could we forget the east? Conrail wraps up this run of <u>HO Scale B36-7</u> <u>Locos</u> with two iconic schemes: The Juniata repaints with white sill and the Conrail Quality repaints. You couldn't set foot on the Water Level Route without seeing one of these leading a high-speed van train. Both of these schemes feature front-only ditch lights, the iconic Juniata style font for the number boards and JBS CR repaint logo on the conductors side.

There are three road numbers to choose from in the white sill stripe versions: 5024, 5046 and 5055. For CR-Q, the road numbers are: 5008, 5039 and 5056. As with the previous run, the red marker lights will be working and the ditch lights will flash when the horn is activated. Buy all three and recreate your Chicago high priority intermodal!

Now a word of warning on ordering this run of <u>HO Scale B36-7 Locomotives</u>: **DON'T WAIT**! This run has <u>extremely limited quantities</u>. Late last year, the factory notified us that they had an open production window and needed a ready-made project immediately. Enter the B36-7s. 



Time to go pre-modern and introduce the <u>USRA Single Sheathed Boxcar</u>! During World War I, US railroads struggled to keep wartime traffic moving, with plenty of car shortages and the constant need for more freight to be moved. To solve this issue, President Wilson formed the United States Railway Association, or USRA for short. Their first task was to develop common designs for freight cars, one of which came in the form of a 40' single-sheathed wooden boxcar. Over 25,000 copies were built, starting in 1918.




Got wood? ...sheathes, that is.

Did we mention OVER 25,000 <u>USRA Single Sheathed Cars</u> were built? that's enough to fill over 3 Elkhart Yards (For you western folk, think Colton...). That's a lot of cars! These were originally delivered to 22 different railroads and lasted well into the 1950s, many in their original form. Several railroads would later rebuild these cars with steel sides. OK, that's enough history class for today, let's see those 3D renders and model features.

Production and Shipping Delays In Our Industry by Jason Shron

In comparison to many industries such as tourism and restaurants, model railroading has been largely spared the negative effects of COVID. Apart from an extended shutdown in February/March 2020, production of model trains was almost normal for most of last year. In fact, our hobby has received a boost in interest and sales as many people rediscovered their love of model trains during the various lockdowns.

However, COVID has had a knock-on effect which is now hurting us in a big way. It started late last year. Normally, factory workers go home a couple of weeks before Chinese New Year and return a couple of weeks after. This past year, a number of provinces in China advised their citizens to come home early or risk not coming home at all. Many workers at model train factories in Guangdong province thus went home early and this caused many model train deliveries to be delayed. Our <u>HO Scale SW1200</u> was one victim of this delay.

The next hurdle has been a global microchip shortage. Most of the world's microchips are produced in one massive complex in Taiwan. The demand for microchips has far exceeded supply, and every industry is affected. For Rapido, this meant that our B36-7s sat in the factory for three weeks - mostly assembled! - waiting for circuit boards. Decoder manufacturers are in the same crunch, and model train companies around the world are not able to get the decoders we need for our models.




Hey Ningnong! I asked for a photo of a trans-Pacific container ship. What the heck is this? (Bobby: No, you just asked for a container ship.)

Now we have another hurdle - kick us when we're down! - in the way of a global shipping container shortage and congestion at ports. In the almost 17 years I've been in this business, I have never seen anything like this.


The cost to ship a container has gone from about \$5000 to \$15000. Because model trains are relatively small for their value, most of our shipments go LCL, or less-than-container load. The normal time from pickup at our factory to delivery at Rapido HQ is about five weeks. To give you an idea of shipping times now, our second SW1200 shipment left the factory on May 14th. All going well, it will arrive here around July 15th.

The delays are caused by the aforementioned container shortage, exacerbated by a COVID outbreak at the port that almost model train manufacturers use: Yantian, in Shenzhen. When the shipments arrive at the west coast, they normally get on a train within three days. Now it's taking two weeks. Our HO scale <u>Meat Reefers</u> are in Prince Rupert, British Columbia now. Every day we get the same message: "Container Waiting to be Loaded Onto Carriage for Inland Movement."



Why am I telling you all this? Well, for two reasons. Firstly, we at Rapido like to keep our customers informed. When something goes wrong, we tell you. We're not big on spin at Rapido. Back in 2012 I was looking at the future financing of the company. At a meeting with my uncle and a financial adviser, the adviser said "You don't want shareholders. You don't want to have to report to them." To which my uncle - a corporate lawyer - replied, "Have you see Jason's newsletters? He tells his customers more information than most CEOs tell their shareholders."

Obviously, when shipments are delayed this has an impact on cash flow. I recommend you pick up the July issue of <u>Railroad Model Craftsman</u> as my column explains the ins and outs of cash flow for the model train industry. And for other reasons, too! It's a great magazine.

The second reason I am telling you is so you know why there will be some delays in deliveries in the coming months. I know we are all eager to get the latest models in, but please have patience and bear with us. Stuff is going to take a bit longer to get here.

Rapido will get through this slowdown, as we've got through many tougher periods in the past. In 2007 our entire production was put on the back burner because the factory owner got a huge contract to make plastic plates and cutlery! Even with the current headaches, things are a lot better than they used to be...
